1. Reason for the Report

- 1.1 To provide an update on the use of the Councillors' Community Initiative Fund in 2018/19

2. Executive Summary

- 2.1 The Councillors' Community Initiative Fund provides every Member with the ability to use a grant allocation of £500 to address community issues in their wards.
- 2.2 An application form and guidance notes are published on the Council's website together with a record of each year's grant expenditure.
- 2.3 In 2018/19 £27,992 was spent supporting a total of 108 projects/organisations.

3. How this report links to Corporate Priorities

- 3.1 **The Fund is linked to our aims:** Help create a safer and healthier environment for our communities to live & work **and** Protect and improve the environment

4. Detail

- 4.1 The Councillors' Community Support Scheme (Support Scheme) was introduced by the Council in 2014. The Support Scheme aims to support Members in their wards as effective community leaders: (1) identifying community issues or concerns and (2) addressing these issues through their ability to influence service provision and/or their ability to facilitate community self-help.
- 4.2 The Councillors' Community Initiative Fund is one element of the Support Scheme. The Fund consists of a budget of £500 which every councillor can allocate in the form of a grant to support activity by local people that will improve the wellbeing of their communities.
- 4.3 Through this grant fund the Council wants to encourage more people to work together - volunteering their time to work for common beneficial purposes. To be eligible to apply projects and activities must:
- Be run by volunteers from the local community or a Parish Council
 - Benefit the local community

This Fund can support:

- one-off events or ongoing projects
 - capital items or revenue costs
 - new projects or existing projects
- 4.4 A grant application form and guidance note (**Appendix 1: CCIF 19 -20 Guidance Notes**) are on the Council's website. End of year reports are also published on the website for each year of operation. (**Appendix 2: Councillors' Community Initiative Fund End of Year Report 2018-19**).
- 4.5 Completed application forms are received and checked by the Democratic and Community service team, to ensure compliance with the rules, following which the Portfolio Holder for Communities, Leisure, Parks, Sport, Countryside and Housing is asked to consider approval of the grant.
- 4.6 The deadline for applications this year is Friday, 31 January 2020.
- 4.7 The total annual budget for the Support Fund is £28,000. In 2018-19 £27,992 was spent. The Fund was used by members to support a total of 108 projects/organisations during 2018-19.

Councillors' Community Initiative Fund



Guidance Notes 2019-2020

The purpose of this grant is to provide small one off grants to community-run projects and activities

Staffordshire Moorlands District Council aims to support activity by local people that will improve the wellbeing of their communities. Through this grant fund the Council wants to encourage more people to work together - volunteering their time to work together for common beneficial purposes.

To be eligible to apply projects and activities must:

- Be run by volunteers from the local community or a Parish Council
- Benefit the local community

Councillor Support

All applications need the full support of their District Councillor. A list of all District Councillors is available on the District Council's website <https://www.staffsmoorlands.gov.uk/sm/your-council/about-the-council/councillors>

How much funding is available

Each District Councillor has £500.

What we can fund

This Fund can support:

- one-off events or ongoing projects
- capital items or revenue costs
- new projects or existing projects

For example we can pay for set up costs, ongoing running costs, equipment, materials, consumables, publicity, training, transport, room hire.

Criteria and conditions

- 1 Applications must be submitted between **Monday, 13 May 2019 and Friday, 31 January 2020**.
- 2 The application must be supported by the District Councillor(s) in the Ward that will benefit from the activity or project. Part Two of the Application Form must be completed by the District Councillor(s).
- 3 Part One of the application form must be fully completed by the group or organisation applying for the grant. After completing Part One, return the form to your District Councillor who will complete Part Two.

- 4 Where the total request for funding from the Council is £2,000 or over for an item/service you are purchasing please enclose copies of three quotes from alternative suppliers or explain why there is a preferred supplier.
- 5 The application must demonstrate how your organisation or project benefits a community in Staffordshire Moorlands.
- 6 The activity must be organised or managed by members of the local community, involving volunteers from the local community.
- 7 Applicants must be able to demonstrate that the grant is an important contribution to the success of the project or activity.
- 8 Applications must be from community-based organisations, this can include informal groups set up just to organise the project or activity.
- 9 To receive funding the group should either have a bank account in its name (requiring two signatories) or have another formal voluntary/community group which can receive and administer the funding on its behalf.
- 10 Any changes to the project or activity the funding has been originally granted for, requires further approval from the District Council.
- 11 Where possible groups should publicly acknowledge the support of Staffordshire Moorlands District Council.
- 12 Successful applicants must do their best to ensure that the activity or project is open to all the members of the local community for which it is intended to benefit.
- 13 Where an application for grant is refused the applicant can apply again.
- 14 Any grants that are not spent must be returned to the District Council.
- 15 Where projects and activities involve children and young people and/or vulnerable adults, groups must have relevant policies and procedures in place.
- 16 Successful applicants must ensure that permissions are obtained from relevant authorities (e.g. Planning Permission, Road Closure Order, Entertainment Licence etc.)

What we cannot fund

Voluntary Sector Services

Generally CCIF does not fund voluntary sector services as they tend to be significantly larger organisations. CCIF focuses on smaller groups and organisations which are community-run.

Parish Councils

CCIF can support community-based activity and volunteering which is also supported by the Parish Council or community projects delivered by Parish Councils or Parish Council activities designed to solve a local problem or issue. It is not a substitute fund for services and activities which Parish Councils are responsible.

Retrospective Grants/Debts

CCIF does not make retrospective grants. However sometimes groups may have unexpected bills and expenses which can result in a shortfall in the groups' general running costs. CCIF can help to cover a group or organisation's general running costs.

Religious Activities

CCIF does not fund religious activities, but it can fund local churches and other places of worship. Many places of worship are used by community groups and host a variety of community events and activities. However, if the application is specifically for a religious activity, then this cannot be funded.

Organisations that do not provide benefit to the residents of the Staffordshire Moorlands

Applications must be from organisations that benefit the residents of Staffordshire Moorlands.

Non-Voluntary Organisations

CCIF does not fund non-voluntary organisations. For example, CCIF does not fund schools as they are not voluntary organisations. (However CCIF could support PTFAs which are voluntary).

Individuals

CCIF does not fund individuals. Applicants need to clearly demonstrate that there will be community benefit.

Political Activities

CCIF does not fund political activities.

Frequently Asked Questions

Can Councillors support groups and organisations that they are involved with?

Yes they can. Councillors should declare any interests on Part Two of the Application Form where there is a specific question about this.

Can CCIF fund temporary or informal groups?

Yes it can. CCIF intends to support grass-roots, community-led activity, this includes temporary projects or one-off events and activities. Under these circumstances the group or organisation may not have its own bank account, therefore the CCIF grant can be paid to another group or organisation which is willing to accept the grant on their behalf.

Do groups and organisations need to send in copies of invoices/ receipts/ quotes?

No, groups and organisations do not need to supply this paperwork. CCIF offers local groups and organisations small amounts of funding, this level of monitoring would be disproportionate to the level of grant. Local Councillors will have good knowledge of and a good relationship with the group or organisation that they are supporting, and would therefore be aware of any issues with the group.

How are grants publicised?

Councillors or groups may wish to make their own arrangements for publicising grants.

What types of projects have been funded in the past?

A full list of all grants awarded in previous years is available on the District Council's website www.staffsmoorlands.gov.uk

Help Answering Questions on the Application Form

How many local people (volunteers) help to organise this activity?

Local volunteers must help to organise the activity, otherwise the application is not eligible. Whether you have 2 volunteers or 100 volunteers, please make sure you answer this question.

Please describe the project or activity.

Not all activities have a specific name. A short simple name is okay. For example if you are applying for general running costs, this can be the name of the activity.

How many people will benefit from this activity?

For regular activities – please state how many people usually take part.

For future events – please state how many people you hope will attend – your target number of people or your best estimate is okay.

For environmental improvements – it can be assumed that most people living in or visiting the town/village/parish will benefit from the environmental improvement.

How will people benefit from this activity?

Please explain how the project will make a difference to the people that take part. For example:

- Reduce social isolation
- Learn new skills
- Improve the physical environment
- Promote community spirit and cohesion
- Promote health and wellbeing
