UK100 also holds an annual parliamentary reception to lobby on behalf of its membership for action towards achieving Net Zero. The APPG brings together a wide range of professions to build political consensus for what's needed in the finance sector to reach Net Zero. At a more local level, the meeting of the Council on 2 December 2020, the Council unanimously carried a motion to "call upon the Government to introduce an outright ban on the practice of peatland and vegetation burning and to ensure the protection of peatlands across the UK for the sake of future generations". The Council also unanimously passed a motion at its meeting on 8 December 2021 to "lobby our two Members of Parliament to ask them to: i) raise with the Secretary of State for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities the need to make it a Statutory Duty for all local authorities to create and deliver a climate change action plan, and ii) to give local authorities the powers and resources to deliver these plans [in line with national policies]." 3	Requests that the Chair of the Community Overview and Scrutiny Panel establishes a sub committee to undertake detailed research into the effects of climate change in the District, to include consideration of all relevant data and monitoring information available, and to involve evidence from relevant stakeholders, with a view to recommending to the Council an effective, achievable and costed plan of actions to address climate change within the Staffordshire Moorlands.	As detailed in the Cabinet report from 7 December 2021 and COSP report of 8 November 2021, the Council went beyond this undertaking and also established working groups to look at district greenhouse gas emissions from Council activity, travel and transport, housing, industry, agriculture, land use and biodiversity, waste, and energy production. These working groups gathered evidence from many outside agencies and experts to identify actions that could reduce emissions. The recommendations from the Working Groups were reported at Appendix A of the report "SMDC Draft Climate Change Part 2 Plan" that was considered by COSP on 15 November 2021. The aim of these task-and-finish groups was to inform the creation of a Climate Change Plan for the district. This plan was adopted by the Council in December 2021. The plan was subsequently independently reviewed by Climate Emergency UK, who gave the plan an overall score of 87%: the 2 nd highest score by a district council in the country ² . Notably, the Council was awarded full marks in several categories including "commitment and integration", and "community engagement and communications". The Council was also scored 4 out of 5 for "measuring and setting emissions targets".	Achieved
