1. Reason for the Report

- 1.1 The purpose of the report is to allow the robust scrutiny of the Council's Treasury Management performance in 2022/23 in compliance with the Chartered Institute of Public Finance and Accountancy (CIPFA) Code of Practice on Treasury Management and generally accepted good practice.

2. Recommendation

- 2.1 That the Annual Treasury Management Report 2022/23 is recommended to Council for approval.

3. Executive Summary

- 3.1 The Council is required through regulations issued under the Local Government Act 2003 to produce an annual treasury report reviewing treasury management activities for the year.

- 3.2 The The Annual Treasury Management Report for 2022/23 considers the following areas:

- The Council's treasury position at the end of the year
- Interest rate movements during the year
- Borrowing activity
- Investment performance & portfolio

- 3.3 There will be a supplementary report which will cover capital activity and the

impact on the overall borrowing need, and related prudential indicators. This will be presented to a subsequent Audit & Regulatory Committee when the information is available through the Closure of Accounts for 2022/23.

3.4 The Executive Director & Chief Finance Officer confirms that borrowing was only undertaken for a capital purpose and the statutory borrowing limit (the authorised limit) was not breached.

3.5 The main headlines include:

- Total debt at 31st March 2023 was £61.8million including loans from Public Works Loan Board, Market Loans and a Local Authority Loan. There was one extinguished loan in the year of £3.3million and one new short term loan of £2million.
- Overall borrowing costs are estimated to be £182,499 underspent against the budget, owing to an increase in the charge to the HRA and less external borrowing than anticipated.
- The average investment portfolio held during the year was £29.1million invested with a total of nine institutions, yielding £549,685 in investment income. A surplus of £446,015 was achieved against the budget due to the frequent increases in the Bank of England base rate.
- The average return achieved by the Council on its investment portfolio for the year was 1.89%. Year-end investments totalled £16.5million all internally managed by the Council's Treasury Management Team.

4. **How this report links to Corporate Priorities**

4.1 An effective Treasury Management function is critical in safeguarding and effectively managing the financial resources at the Council's disposal. Sufficient financial resources are required to deliver and underpin the Council's main priorities.

5.1 This report sets out the Treasury Management position for High Peak Borough Council for 2022/23. As such it is a statement of fact and there are no options to consider.
